

## **Summer STARS 2021 – An extended learning plan.**

The Carrollton Exempted Village School District will offer a K-12, voluntary academic program this June and July for any student in the district. Summer STARS (Student Tutoring And Resource Services). Governor Mike DeWine issued a directive to all Ohio public school districts in February, 2021 “to work with their communities to help students advance and make-up for any learning that may have been lost or delayed because of the pandemic over the past year.” Attendance is not mandatory, however perfect attendance incentives will be offered. Obviously, any student attempting to achieve credit recovery cannot miss class. Students may attend one or both sessions, depending upon their needs.

Because Carrollton has many students experiencing learning gaps, the district will offer conventional, in-person classes, as well as the more typical “credit recovery” program that has been established in Carrollton High School. The district has created a 5<sup>th</sup> quarter, which begins on Monday, June 7<sup>th</sup> and concludes Thursday, June 24<sup>th</sup> and a 6<sup>th</sup> quarter, which begins on Monday, June 28<sup>th</sup> and concludes on Thursday, July 15<sup>th</sup>. This unprecedented 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester will operate weekly each Monday through Thursday from 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM, except for the week of July 4<sup>th</sup>, which will be a Tuesday through Friday week of classes, due to Monday, July 5<sup>th</sup> being observed as the national holiday and the district will be closed.

All classes will be held at Carrollton High School – Middle School located at 205 Scio Road SW. All safety protocols will be in place per the General Carroll County Health District. The district will operate the K-5 program on the first floor of Carrollton Middle School and the 6-8 program on the second floor of CMS, with all grade 9-12 classes operating in the Carrollton High School wing of the building. Carrollton teachers will be teaching these courses. The 21<sup>st</sup> century campus located on Scio Road SW is equipped with central air conditioning in all of the buildings and offers the Outdoor Learning Center with over 5 miles of trails and 10 identified learning stations, the Power Training Center and Greenhouse, Community Stadium, and the Fieldhouse and for hands-on learning activities.

At least five bus routes with 10 dedicated “satellite” stops will be offered each morning and afternoon for students attending the Summer STARS school program. These “satellite” stops will closely parallel the district food stops around Carroll County this past year and will be finalized and announced at a later date. The Summer Feeding Program and school cafeteria will be open all summer to district students. Breakfast and lunch will be served to all Summer STARS students.

Principals and guidance counselors will be targeting students at-risk in not being promoted to their next grade level for the 2021-2022 school year. Open registration is also encouraged. Core courses will be offered with emphasis in Math, Literacy, Science, and Social Studies. A course schedule will be released later this spring.
